Resolutions adopted by the General Assembly, the Economic and Social Council and the Trusteeship Council are referred to in this Yearbook by their official numbers, the number of the session at which it was adopted appearing in brackets after the number of each resolution. Thus, resolution 290 (IV) refers to the General Assembly's 290th resolution, adopted at its fourth session; resolution 222 (IX) refers to the 222nd resolution of the Economic and Social Council, adopted at its ninth session; and resolution 83 (IV) to the 83rd resolution of the Trusteeship Council, adopted at its fourth session; the context indicates which organ is referred to. In the case of the Security Council, the document citation of the original mimeographed resolution is given. These resolutions are, in general, reproduced in printed form in the Official Records; they are also collected in single mimeographed documents; S/INF/2 covering 1946 to 1948, and S/INF/3 covering 1949. In the case of the International Court of Justice, the full citations are given for documents cited.

In the case of other documents, such as reports and draft resolutions, the original citation is given. The basic symbol forms are as follows: General Assembly, A/-; Security Council, S/-; Economic and Social Council, E/-; Trusteeship Council, T/-. In many instances, these documents appear as supplements to the Official Records. As far as discussions are concerned, it has been thought sufficient to specify the meetings at which the discussions took place, which correspond to the members of the verbatim or summary records concerned. A documentary footnote at the beginning of each of the substantive sections gives the volumes of the Official Records which cover the discussions concerned.
