## APPENDIX II

# STRUCTURE OF THE UNITED NATIONS

### THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY

The General Assembly is composed of all the Members of the United Nations. (For delegations to the 10th session, see APPENDIX IV.)

President, 10th session: Jose Maza (Chile).

Vice-Presidents, 10th session: China, Ethiopia, France, Luxembourg, USSR, United Kingdom, United States (the Chairmen of the respective delegations act as Vice-Presidents).

The Assembly has four types of committees: Main Committees, procedural committees, standing committees, and subsidiary and ad hoc bodies.

#### MAIN COMMITTEES

Six Main Committees are established under the rules of procedure of the General Assembly.

First Committee. Political and Security (including the regulation of armaments).

Second Committee. Economic and Financial.

Third Committee. Social, Humanitarian and Cultural.

Fourth Committee. Trusteeship (including Non-Self-Governing Territories).

Fifth Committee. Administrative and Budgetary.

Sixth Committee. Legal.

Each Member may be represented by one person on each Main Committee.

In addition to these six Main Committees, the General Assembly may constitute other committees, on which all Members have the right to be represented. During 1955, as at previous sessions, it established an Ad Hoc Political Committee.

### PROCEDURAL COMMITTEES

There are two procedural committees: the General Committee and the Credentials Committee.

#### GENERAL COMMITTEE

In accordance with the rules of procedure, the General Committee consists of the President of the General Assembly, as Chairman, the Vice-Presidents of the General Assembly, and the Chairmen of the six Main Committees and of the Ad Hoc Political Committee.

#### CREDENTIALS COMMITTEE

This Committee consists of nine Members appointed by the Assembly on the proposal of the President. At the 10th session it was composed of Afghanistan, Australia, Colombia, the Dominican Republic, France, Indonesia, Iraq, the USSR and the United States, with the representative of Iraq as Chairman.

### STANDING COMMITTEES

Two standing committees are established by the rules of procedure: the Advisory Committee on Administrative and Budgetary Questions and the Com-

mittee on Contributions. Each consists of experts appointed in their individual capacities.
